Declaration for California Proposition 65

Dear Customer,

during normal operations it is not required to touch our products in any way.

Under the structure of California's Safe Drinking Water & Toxic Enforcement Act of 1986 (Proposition 65 (Prop 65)) certain parts of Hirschmann products may contain one or more of chemicals above the safe harbor levels on the Prop 65 List, for example lead and Tetrabromobisphenol A (TBBPA). Under normal conditions of use, the lead or other chemicals do not free up from the product.

Please note, however, that up to 3% lead may be present in brass alloy spacers. These brass alloy spacers as well as PCBs, which might contain TBBPA, are not intended to be touched by users, so we exclude oral absorption of lead and have not marked the products, which are intended for professional use, only.

This information is based on the Prop 65 chemical list as of the date of this letter.
