Statement Regarding Sec.899 – Prohibition on Certain Telecommunications and Video Surveillance Services or Equipment

Dear Customer,

To address a perceived cybersecurity risk, an Interim Final Rule under the National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) for Fiscal Year 2019 became effective on August 13, 2019. Section 889 prohibits the use of certain telecommunications and video surveillance equipment or services from specified vendors.

Belden represents that it has made commercially reasonable efforts to review the products listed below for compliance with NDAA Section 889(a)(1)(A) and 889(a)(1)(B), and GSAR 552.204-70.

Based on these efforts, Belden does not knowingly purchase components from, or retain services provided by, companies (and their subsidiaries) prohibited under Fiscal Year 2019 NDAA (Public Law 115-232) and Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) Case 2018-026.

This letter applies only to routers, switches, and I/O modules with the following declared Country of Origin:

- NetModule: DE, CN, and LT
